## What to Do Next

Congratulations on passing your DMV Third-Party Driving Exam. You will receive a 90 Day Temporary License from the Examiner. Please carry that with you along with your Learner's Permit until you receive your new license in the mail. In order to get your new license please follow the steps outlined below. DMV recommends you complete this process as soon as possible to avoid and lapse in time between the 90 day Temporary and the issuance of your Junior Operator's License.

- Scroll down to the bottom of the page and click on License/Permit Application VL-021
- Fill out the form, save it then print it out or print the form and fill it out in pen
- Be sure to sign the form and if you are under the age of 18 your parent or guardian must sign also.
